The Patriot of Past President and our current Treasurer Gordon Robinson: Private Alexander McMillan.

Alexander McMillan was born August 12, 1749 in County Derry, Ireland. His wife, Margaret, was born April 2, 1762 in Augusta County, Virginia. They wed in 1778. Private McMillan served with the rebels at Quebec and in the Battle of King's Mountain, North Carolina. The King's Mountain engagement involved seven militia units commanded by Patriot Whigs. A Militia of Loyalist Colonials was commanded by British Major Patrick Ferguson. The "Over the Mountain" patriot forces won the day, capturing 598 Loyalists, nine of whom were hanged for treason. He also saw action in Massachusetts and Virginia. Alexander McMillan died April 12, 1836 in Knox County, Tennessee.
