The Patriot of Past President George Dersheimer: Private First Class Manuel Dersheimer.

Private First Class Manuel Dersheimer was born in 1755. He volunteered in the adventure of the American Revolution, joining the Pennsylvania Unit known as the Flying Camp. PFC Manuel Dersheimer was enrolled in Captain Heller's Third Company, 2nd Battalion, Northampton County Militia. The 2nd Battalion saw action in the first two organized battles of the war against England; Long Island and Fort Washington. He was captured at Fort Washington and held prisoner on a prison ship in New York

Harbor. He escaped with the help of other Patriots and returned to Pennsylvania. Manuel rejoined Heller's Company and fought in the Indian Wars with General Anthony (Mad Dog) Wayne, helping to secure the Northern Frontier in the Ohio Territory. Manuel Dersheimer died in 1796.
