

Alexander LeGrande:

Alexander LeGrande spent all his life in
Virginia in the area bounded by
Goochland, Cumberland, Buckingham and
Prince Edwards Counties. He was
born in Goochland in late 1732. He served
in the First Virginia
Regiment Regulars in the War between
Great Britain and France as a
Sargent under Major Andrew Lewis. He was
in his fifties during the
American Revolution, and contributed 200

pounds of beef to the Colonist cause.

Dear members, annually the deadline for the submission of Eagle Scholarship applications is Jan 1st. There are approximately a dozen presently submitted by Eagle Scout chapter chmn. A few additional candidate applications will possibly be accepted during the next week or so, providing the chapter Eagle Scout Scholarship Chmn (coach) immediately submits the candidates signed application with the date of the Eagle Board of Review with parent and Scoutmasters signatures,

Who can apply? The recognition and scholarship is open to every BSA ranked Eagle Scout that can prove they are currently registered in an active BSA unit (troop or Venture Crew) and they have not reached their 19th birthday during the year (2016) of application. (The application year is the calendar YEAR, 1 Jan to 31 Dec.).

Candidates need to complete only
one application for chapter
competition. If he wins the chapter
judging contest it advances to the
state competition. If he wins the
Texas Society contest he advances to
the National Society competition
judging held annually at Louisville's
Spring Leadership Meeting. 1st step
contact your area SAR Eagle Scout
chapter chmn. to determine the
deadline for submission.

Applicants need to submit:

Completed application form signed by you and your parents/guardian.

Four generation Ancestry Chart.

Original patriotic theme of no more than 500 words.

Any Eagle Scout that has not reached his 19th birthday should be

encouraged annually to compete for the SAR's Eagle Scout Scholarship even if that individual has previously been chapter, state and/or the national society winner. Simply submit a new updated application with a new less than 500 word patriotic theme and four generation Ancestry Chart.

There is a handsome SAR Chapter
Winner Medal presented to a Eagle
Scout usually with an accompanying
SAR /BSA Patch for a candidate
winner selected by chapters.



Saturday, January 07, 2017 I presented to the Sam Houston Chapter of NSDAR in Clear Lake, about 60 in attendance.


Have a committee of 7 working on verbiage for the corporate collateral brochure. Will meet and draft the copy within the next couple of weeks.

OUR REVOLUTIONARY HISTORY

The American Revolution (1775-83) is also known as the American Revolutionary War and the U.S. War of Independence. The conflict arose from growing tensions between residents of Great Britain's 13 North American colonies and the colonial government, which represented the British crown. Skirmishes between British troops and colonial militiamen in Lexington and Concord in April 1775 kicked off the armed conflict, and by the following summer, the rebels were waging a fullscale war for their independence. France entered the American Revolution on the side of the colonists in 1778, turning what had essentially been a civil war into an international conflict. After French assistance helped the Continental Army force the British surrender at Yorktown, Virginia, in 1781, the Americans had effectively won their independence, though fighting would not formally end until 1783.
