At the TXSSAR Annual State Meeting in April, Chapter Past-President William Adriance was awarded the Patriot Medal, The Patriot Medal is the highest award that the Society gives to deserving members. Other Galvez Chapter members who have received this award are former state president David Peterson (deceased), former chapter presidents Bill Whatley, John (Pete) Lenes and John Hamlin. Other Awards presented were given to Chapter Secretary John Hamlin was awarded the Silver Roger Sherman Medal. Both Bill and John hold positions at the state level on committees. The Bernado de Galvez Chapter was also awarded the Ross Shipman Newsletter Single Sheet Award, the Public Service Award and the Flag Presentation Award.







Bernardo de Galvez Chapter #1 Color Guard attend funeral for Former State President David H. Peterson.

Mr. David Howard Peterson, born November 11, 1927 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin passed from this life Wednesday morning, March 24, 2021, in Hitchcock.

David was born to Opal Kuns of Illinois and Elmer S. Peterson, born in Norway. His youth was spent on the lands in Vermillion County, Illinois on a farm homesteaded by his 3rd Great Grandfather in 1844. At age 16, during World War II, David entered the U.S. Merchant Marine Training Station in New York and received training in the engine department aboard ship. He left the Merchant Marine after having served 2 ½ years in the Atlantic, Mediterranean and Pacific war zones. David was awarded the Medal for Freedom for his part in the "Great Patriotic War" (1939-1945) from the Russian government for his service during "Murmansk Run".

He served in the U.S. Army from 1949 to 1955, receiving basic military training at Camp Breckenridge, Kentucky with the 101st Airborne Division. He was sent to Japan where he was reassigned to active duty with the 49th Field Artillery Battalion, 17th Regimental Combat Team, 7th Infantry Division in Japan. One year later he landed at Inchon, Korea in September1950 and served until October 1951. David was awarded the Army Commendation Medal for heroic action in the evacuation of refugees from the Yalu River in North Korea. He attained the rank of Staff Sergeant.

He was later employed with North American Aviation in 1963. This company later became Rockwell International and was prime contractor for the Saturn-Apollo moon project. David was transferred to Kennedy Space Center for the duration of the Apollo moon project and was later assigned work at Johnson Space Center in Texas working with the crew equipment group on approach and landing tests on the shuttle Orbiter project. He is responsible for 2 inventions on the

shuttle Orbiter and has received several certificates of recognition for his work and contribution to the space program from management and astronauts alike. David retired from the space program in 1998.

David joined the ranks of the Sons of the American Revolution, in 1982. He served as president of the Bernardo de Galvez chapter#1 in Galveston. David served as state president from 1991-1992. Other organizations of note are; past president, Sons of the Revolution, he served as Deputy Governor General, Society of Colonial Wars. Past president of the War of 1812; Sons and Daughters of the Pilgrims; The Aztec Club of 1847; The Sons of the American Colonists; The Society of Indiana Pioneers; The Illinois Prairie Pioneers; The Ancestry; The International Society of the descendants of Charlemagne, The Royal Society of St. George and is an Admiral in the Texas Navy. David is a life member of the First Marine Division Association, The Seventh Infantry Division Association and the Korean War Veterans.
