## Gold Sestercentennial (250th Anniversary) Recognition Medal



We are pleased to announce that two of our Officers, President Billy Mayo and Secretary John Loper, have received approval from National to receive this distinguished Gold Medal.

The medal is designed to encourage and recognize those compatriots, chapters and societies to participate in local, state, national and international events which publicly educate, and recognize, honor, and celebrate the heroes of the American Revolution. Participation involves the planning and execution of these events, as well as attendance. The medal covers the celebration of any event's 250th anniversary where said event related directly to acts of resistance to British attempts to coerce the residents in America: from the first Parliamentary Acts protested after the conclusion of the French and Indian Wars, through the armed struggle of the American War for Independence, to the ratification of the Treaty of Paris by the Continental Congress. This therefore will cover any public celebrations in the Period from 2014 to 2033.
